Forest County Health Department urges residents to Get Vaccinated

As the number of COVID-19 cases in Forest County continue to rise, the Forest County Health Department continues to urge residents to get vaccinated to protect against severe illness from COVID-19. The healthcare system is overwhelmed. We need our residents to help out by doing what they can to stop this disease from spreading.

If you have not been vaccinated against COVID-19, please do so. Some of the other ways to stop the spread include staying home if you are sick, practicing good hand washing, avoiding large gatherings, and wearing a mask when out in public.

The COVID-19 vaccines are very safe and effective at preventing illness, hospitalization, and death. It is one of the ways residents can help reduce the burden on the healthcare systems across the state. According to the Department of Health Services, the rate of hospitalization among not fully vaccinated people is 9 times higher than the rate among fully vaccinated people. The rate of COVID-19 deaths among not fully vaccinated people is 11 times higher than the rate among fully vaccinated people. The current surge in COVID-19 cases continues to be driven by cases among people who are not fully vaccinated.

The COVID-19 vaccines remain the best way to protect yourself, your family, and your community from COVID-19 and the highly infectious Delta variant. High vaccination coverage will not only reduce the spread of the virus, but also help prevent new, and possibly more concerning, variants from emerging.

If everyone in the community does their part in this fight, we can keep our residents healthy and our businesses and our schools open. Please help us to "Stop the Spread".

Spotted Lanternfly Alert

The Spotted Lanternfly is an invasive species native to Asia. In 2014 it was found in Pennsylvania, and has since spread to multiple counties which are now quarantined.

If you see a spotted lanternfly, kill it, squash it, smash it...just get rid of it. In the fall, these bugs will lay egg masses with 30-50 eggs each. These are called bad bugs for a reason, don't let them take over your county next.

The spotted lanternfly causes serious damage including oozing sap, wilting, leaf curling and dieback in trees, vines, crops and many other types of plants. In addition to plant damage, when spotted lanternflies feed, they excrete a sugary substance, called honeydew, that encourages the growth of black sooty mold. This mold is harmless to people however it causes damage to plants. In counties infested and quarantined for spotted lanternfly, residents report hundreds of these bad bugs that affect their quality of life and ability to enjoy the outdoors during the spring and summer months. Spotted lanternflies will cover trees, swarm in the air, and their honeydew can coat decks and play equipment.

In addition to damaging trees and affecting quality of life, the spotted lanternfly is a huge threat to the agriculture industry. The economic impact could total in the hundreds of millions of dollars and hundreds of thousands of jobs for those in the grapes, apple, hops, and hardwood industries.

The spotted lanternfly is approximately 1" long and 1/2" wide at rest. The forewing is grey with black spots and the wings tips are reticulated black blocks outlined in grey. The hind wings have contrasting patches of red and black with a white band. The legs and head are black; the abdomen is yellow with broad black bands. Immature stages are black with white spots, and develop red patches as they grow.

The building also features a 20,000 square-foot field house with synthetic turf and a 110-yard jogging track. Both the gymnasium and the field house can serve as a competition and practice space for sports as well as a venue for tribal powwows.

A centerpiece of the facility is an 8,000 square-foot recreation and training pool which includes a play area, water slide and separate spa. Swimming lessons will also be available for individuals of all ages and abilities.

The fitness center will allow visitors access to state-of-the-art exercise equipment and a wide variety of free weights, cardio equipment, and individualized machines. Certified instructors will also lead a variety of group classes like Yoga, Boxing Strength, Step Aerobics, Bootcamps, Pilates, HIIT, and Senior Fitness. A 25-foot climbing wall with four auto belays and four top rope options is also available for individuals or groups to use.

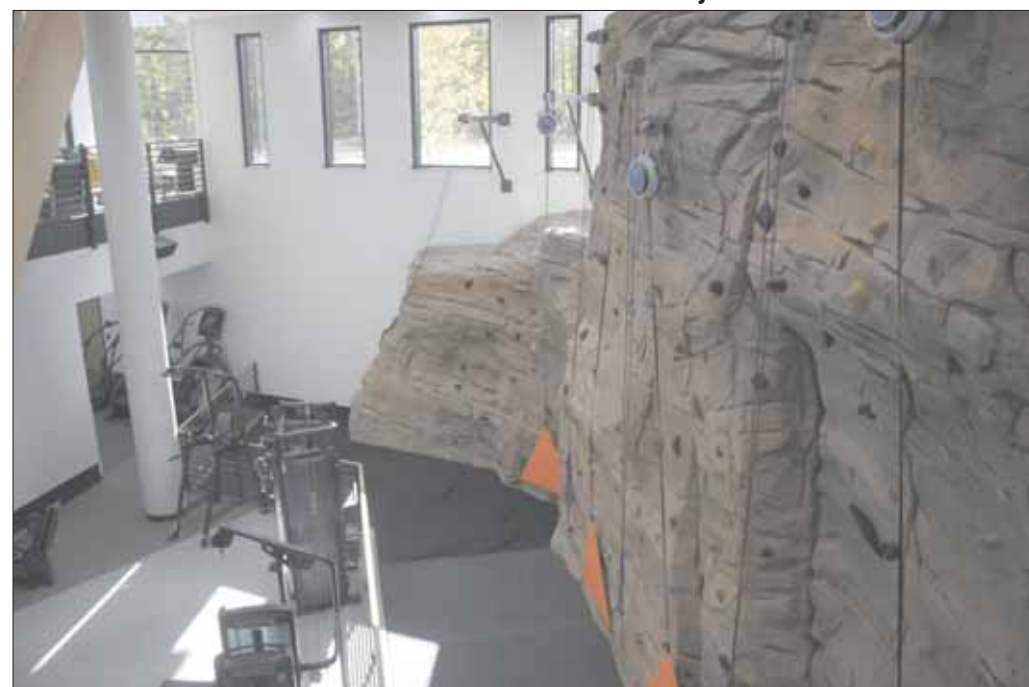

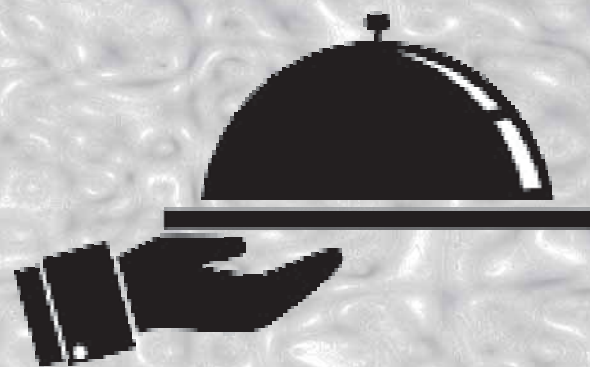

Flu Shot Update What's new in 2021

Fall is in the air, even as we try to soak up the last bits of summer. As you prepare for the colder and shorter days ahead, you may be winterizing boats, chopping firewood, and preserving that delicious summer produce. Your to-do list might feel long (or maybe you don't want to even think about the coming of winter), but make sure that in your preparations for the changing of seasons, you prioritize getting your annual flu shot.

We remain in the midst of the coronavirus pandemic, and it's easy to forget about all of the non-covid preventative care that we do to keep ourselves as healthy as possible. But in fact, because of the pandemic, it's super important to do everything we can to stay well and out of the hospital. Flu vaccines are a major tool to help achieve this goal.

Many folks have questions or thoughts around the flu vaccine, and there is a lot of confusing and conflicting discussion out there about vaccines in general, especially now. Our goal is to provide you with accurate, science-based information about the flu vaccine to help you make an educated and informed decision. This article addresses some of the common misconceptions and questions people have about flu shots.

Why would I get a vaccine for the flu? It's basically just a bad cold.

While for some people, this is true, influenza can be much more serious than a cold. The flu can cause a high fever, intense body aches, severe cough, and nasty headaches. It can also lead to pneumonia, which is the most common reason for someone with the flu to be admitted to the hospital. In the US, annual deaths from the flu range from 12,000-60,000+, depending on the severity of the common strains of flu for that year. The exception to

this was last year, when there were estimated to be about 700 deaths for the flu, likely due to covid-related masking and school and business closures.

The flu shot doesn't even keep you from getting sick, so why bother?

The CDC states that flu vaccine effectiveness ranges from 40-60% every year, but this doesn't tell the whole story. Multiple studies have shown that the flu shot is extremely effective at preventing severe illness and hospitalization. So while you may be vaccinated and still get the flu, having the shot can mean that you simply feel crummy and being out of work or school for a couple of days instead of being hospitalized.

The only time I ever got the flu was from the vaccine.

This is a common belief and fear among people who are reluctant to get a flu shot. In fact, while you may have relatively minor and short-term side effects from the flu shot like slight fatigue or a sore arm, it is not possible to become sick with the flu from the flu shot. The virus in the injections is dead, and in the live intranasal vaccine it is attenuated, meaning its ability to reproduce and cause illness is removed. Most often, what someone is experiencing in this case is either a common cold rather than the flu, or they were exposed to the influenza virus before their vaccine or shortly after.

Flu shots are full of mercury and lead to dangerous side effects.

Thimerosal is a preservative that is used in multi-dose vials of vaccine to prevent bacteria from growing. It breaks down in the body to ethyl mercury, which is easy for the body to excrete and is not the same as methylmercury, which can build up. When we think about the mercury in fish and recommend limiting consumption, we are referring to methylmercury. Thimerosal has been shown to be safe in numerous studies, but for those who are still concerned, there are single-dose vaccines available for adults and children in pre-filled syringes that do not contain thimerosal.

We recommend getting your flu vaccine as soon as it's available to you, and studies have shown us that any covid booster you might get does not need to be spaced out from other vaccines. Children can receive the vaccine beginning at 6 months and will get two doses spaced a month apart if it's their first year getting the shot. Talk with your provider about their specific recommendations, and be sure to discuss any questions or concerns you have about the flu vaccine with them. Baldwin joins bicameral group across 7 states urging administration to increase biofuels usage

Washington, D.C. – U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin joined a bicameral group of lawmakers spanning seven states in a letter urging the Administration to increase biofuels usage and reject any reduction in biofuel blending requirements.

After recent reports that the Administration may be considering lowering the Renewable Volume Obligations (RVOs), the group raised serious concerns about the harm a reduction in biofuels usage could cause to the Administration's clean energy goals and economic stability of the renewable fuels marketplace.

"We have strong reservations about the potential for the Administration to destroy over 5 billion gallons of biofuel volume from the 2020, 2021, and 2022 RVOs. This action would directly undermine your commitment to address climate change and restore integrity to the Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS)," the Members wrote. "Every gallon of biofuels that is blended into our nation's fuel supply displaces a gallon of oil and cuts carbon emissions...Reducing biofuel blending requirements will increase greenhouse gas emissions."

"Rather than exempting refiners of their obligations under the Clean Air Act, we urge the Administration to provide additional certainty and stability to the renewable fuels marketplace by issuing strong RVOs for 2021 and 2022, and declining to remand any gallons from the 2020 RVO. These actions will create jobs, drive American investment, and cut carbon emissions from the transportation sector," the Members continued.

In September, Baldwin joined a bicameral group of colleagues on a letter sent to Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer and Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi urging them to include support for homegrown renewable fuels in the upcoming reconciliation package.

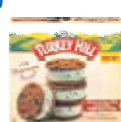

Flu Shot Update. What's new in 2021

Fall is in the air, even as we try to soak up the last bits of summer. As you prepare for the colder and shorter days ahead, you may be winterizing boats, chopping firewood, and preserving that delicious summer produce. Your to-do list might feel long (or maybe you don't want to even think about the coming of winter), but make sure that in your preparations for the changing of seasons, you prioritize getting your annual flu shot.

We remain in the midst of the coronavirus pandemic, and it's easy to forget about all of the non-covid preventative care that we do to keep ourselves as healthy as possible. But in fact, because of the pandemic, it's super important to do everything we can to stay well and out of the hospital. Flu vaccines are a major tool to help achieve this goal.

Many folks have questions or thoughts around the flu vaccine, and there is a lot of confusing and conflicting discussion out there about vaccines in general, especially now. Our goal is to provide you with accurate, science-based information about the flu vaccine to help you make an educated and informed decision. This article addresses some of the common misconceptions and questions people have about flu shots.

Why would I get a vaccine for the flu? It's basically just a bad cold.

While for some people, this is true, influenza can be much more serious than a cold. The flu can cause a high fever, intense body aches, severe cough, and nasty headaches. It can also lead to pneumonia, which is the most common reason for someone with the flu to be admitted to the hospital. In the US, annual deaths from the flu range from 12,000-60,000+, depending on the severity of the common strains of flu for that year. The exception to this was last year, when there were estimated to be about 700 deaths for the flu, likely due to covid-related masking and school and business closures.

The flu shot doesn't even keep you from getting sick, so why bother?

The CDC states that flu vaccine effectiveness ranges from 40-60% every year, but this doesn't tell the whole story. Multiple studies have shown that the flu shot is extremely effective at preventing severe illness and hospitalization. So while you may be vaccinated and still get the flu, having the shot can mean that you simply feel crummy and being out of work or school for a couple of days instead of being hospitalized.

The only time I ever got the flu was from the vaccine.

This is a common belief and fear among people who are reluctant to get a flu shot. In fact, while you may have relatively minor and short-term side effects from the flu shot like slight fatigue or a sore arm, it is not possible to become sick with the flu from the flu shot. The virus in the injections is dead, and in the live intranasal vaccine it is attenuated, meaning its ability to reproduce and cause illness is removed. Most often, what someone is experiencing in this case is either a common cold rather than the flu, or they were exposed to the influenza virus before their vaccine or shortly after.

Flu shots are full of mercury and lead to dangerous side effects.

Thimerosal is a preservative that is used in multi-dose vials of vaccine to prevent bacteria from growing. It breaks down in the body to ethyl mercury, which is easy for the body to excrete and is not the same as methylmercury, which can build up. When we think about the mercury in fish and recommend limiting consumption, we are referring to methylmercury. Thimerosal has been shown to be safe in numerous studies, but for those who are still concerned, there are single-dose vaccines available for adults and children in pre-filled syringes that do not contain thimerosal.

We recommend getting your flu vaccine as soon as it's available to you, and studies have shown us that any covid booster you might get does not need to be spaced out from other vaccines. Children can receive the vaccine beginning at 6 months and will get two doses spaced a month apart if it's their first year getting the shot. Talk with your provider about their specific recommendations, and be sure to discuss any questions or concerns you have about the flu vaccine with them. 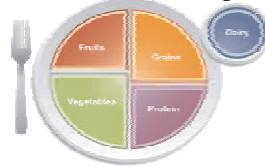
