You probably don't think about it when you unwrap a cough drop and pop it in your mouth, but people in the paper industry have given that wrapper a great deal of thought. It's an example of what the industry calls a specialty paper – a paper developed for a specific purpose and to exacting specifications. In this case, the papermakers have built in a special property called "twistiness" that helps it stay tightly around the cough drop once a machine wraps it. The paper is also specially coated to preserve freshness and to avoid sticking to the cough drop when it is unwrapped by the consumer.

This cough drop paper is just one of thousands of unique paper products made in Wisconsin. Rather than making commodity papers such as newsprint (none is made in Wisconsin), mills create a variety of paper for different applications and converters modify that paper in myriad ways for myriad end uses.

Understanding the future of Wisconsin's paper industry requires some understanding of specialty papers because, unlike the shrinking markets in some commodity papers, the industry sees growth opportunities in specialty applications, particularly where paper may supplant plastic. Consumers are looking for sustainable products and paper increasingly is seen as a more sustainable alternative. Improvements in coating technology, for example, are opening opportunities in paper-based food packaging to replace plastic.

While specialty papers are frequently pointed to as a sustaining force in Wisconsin's paper industry, the term specialty paper is not well-defined even within the industry. Nevertheless, manufacturers and converters

Rebel Volleyball Girls take second in State



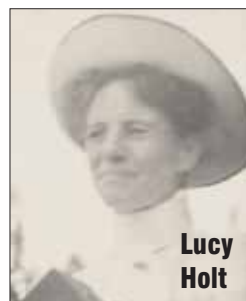

The Holt & Balcom Logging Camp Museum in Lakewood has concluded a very successful 2021 Season. After going dark last year due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, we were determined to open this year. Unfortunately, we had only one school tour, but it was a wonderful experience as 17 Suring fourth graders and their teacher enjoyed "living like a lumberjack" on May 17.

When we resumed our regular summer tour schedule: Saturdays (10-3) from Memorial Day to Labor Day, we assumed our attendance would be down. However, it turned out that we recorded regular numbers, hosting well over a hundred Saturday visitors from all over Wisconsin and ten states (AK, CO, GA, IL, KS, MN, NJ, OR, TX, WA).

Our special program Lucy Loved Lakewood, featuring Lakewood historian Tom Thielke and Camp Director Kathleen Marsh portraying Lucy Holt, drew our biggest crowd of the year on July 17. 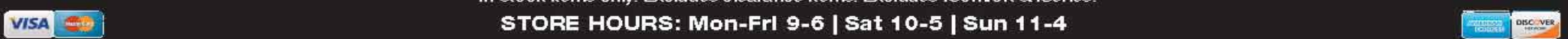

WisDOT charts a new direction in mapping

On GIS Day, November 17, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) recognizes the role Geographic Information Systems plays in providing Wisconsin residents and businesses with tools to inform, plan, make better decisions and solve problems.

From maps locating the state's road construction projects to picturesque Rustic Roads, WisDOT applies user-friendly, interactive GIS technology to make transportation data readily available and understandable.

"Our GIS mapping program is a great example of how WisDOT is applying innovative technology to improve Wisconsin's transportation system," WisDOT Secretary Craig Thompson said. "Whether it's our dynamic highway signs keeping motorists safe, our hotspot analysis to identify dangerous intersections, or the use of special sensor trucks to monitor pavement conditions, technology is part of WisDOT's commitment to continuous improvement for the people of Wisconsin."

Growing list of GIS services

WisDOT recently launched WisDOT Maps. Maps available through this portal are interactive. They allow users to zoom in and out, add data layers, print and export maps, sort and filter data, and perform other actions.

One of WisDOT's newest and most popular maps, Rustic Roads, makes locating these unique, beautiful Wisconsin roads even easier. Using this GIS map, travelers can search for a Rustic Road by county, community, road name or number. The interactive map also provides detailed descriptions of the road.

Transportation Improvement Program maps that include information about planned improvement projects for the next two and six years are helpful tools for local communities and businesses. These maps include basic information about projects: work type, route, project limits and cost range.

WisDOT's project was recognized from a field of 300,000 other candidates. Conservation Corner Cont. from pg. 1 provided some examples of Wisconsin specialty grades to illustrate this important sector.

Food papers
Ahlstrom-Munksjö, which operates four paper mills in Wisconsin, makes a wide range of specialty papers including food wrapping papers. Its website touts the performance of its “sweets, chocolate and snack wrapping paper”:

“High performance twisting, wrapping and folding papers specially developed for sustainable sweets, chocolate and snack packaging... Our Rocalonde™ grades run trouble-free on high-speed twisting machines. They resist the extreme constraints that are exerted and they have supreme twist retention so that sweets always open easily when you want them to – with no annoying rustle!”

Food wrapping paper is a significant chunk of business for Wisconsin paper manufacturers and converters, ranging from paper sleeves (interleaves) between slices of cheese or deli meat, to grease-resistant papers, baking papers and more. Domtar and Verso, like Ahlstrom-Munksjö and others, make a variety of specialty papers aimed at the food wrap market, and converters throughout Wisconsin create thousands of products for different end-uses.

Labels and release liners

Labels are also a big part of Wisconsin specialty paper production. Labels require a face stock, on which the graphics are applied; a release liner, which protects the label adhesive until the label is to be applied to a product; the adhesive; and a top coat to protect the graphics. Specialty papers made in Wisconsin for the wine and spirits industry, for example, stand up to water and ice baths, deliver luxurious appearances and textures, and with custom converting, are scuff resistant, can be cut to odd shapes, adhere to glass, foil, and plastic, and can be printed with digital printing equipment.
