Once Summer finally gets here, so will the mosquitos. Once again, I've been asked to present some information on commercial mosquito sprays.

What's in Mosquito Sprays?
Most residential mosquito control companies use insecticides known as pyrethrins, which are chemicals derived from chrysanthemum flowers that are toxic to insects; or more frequently, pyrethroids, which are synthetic chemicals that mimic pyrethrins. Whether natural or synthetic, these are broad-spectrum insecticides that are highly toxic to a wide variety of insects, not just mosquitoes.

Companies use pyrethrins and pyrethroids in their standard treatment options. Marketing efforts and

Championship Off-Road Series bringing unified sport, best drivers to FCP Crandon Brush Run Race weekend



There are 17 of the two-wheel drive Pro 2 trucks competing at this weekend's first series race in Antigo, including 2021 class champion and Forest County Potawatomi Community Cup winner Jerett Brooks, on June 24-26.

At the end of 2019 the sport of professional off-road short-course racing was facing a decidedly uncertain future. For years, the world's best racers, their teams and corporate supports were forced to decide between one of two national series -- thus fragmenting the sport, its top-tier drivers and a dedicated fan base.

Now preparing to enter its third season of competition, the Midwest-based AMSOIL Championship Off-Road Series has both stabilized and unified the sport with a singular focus for all concerned. The result? Fans coming to the 29th Forest County Potawatomi Brush Run weekend at Crandon International Raceway can look forward to the largest and strongest field of off-road racers in the past two decades.

Scheduled for June 24-26, the event promises to showcase a diverse group of competitors in both the Pro and Sportsman divisions. In stark contrast to only a few seasons ago, a look at the entry list for the sport's premiere Pro 2, Pro 4 and Pro Lite truck classes emphasizes the series' strong and steady path to success. Each of the categories shows stacked fields of the very best racers from around the country and Canada. New names will challenge familiar faces in what promises to be intense battles for race wins and the series championships in the 2022 season.

With six events on its 2022 schedule, the AMSOIL Championship Off-Road series will kick-off this weekend in Antigo, Wisconsin.

Vaccine Clinic June 22nd

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed 7 individuals have been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) since June 1, 2022 with either a PCR, antigen, or home test. County health officials and local partners are contacting individuals who test positive as able. There have been 7 deaths this year related to COVID-19. This is a snapshot of the numbers as they are continuously changing throughout the day.

The Forest County Health Department encourages community members to get vaccinated, practice good hand hygiene, wear a mask or cloth face covering when necessary, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are experiencing any symptoms or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please contact your health care provider and ask to be tested. If positive, please isolate yourself away from others for 5 days since symptom onset and wear a mask for the 5 days following your release from isolation.

The Forest County Health Department will be holding a Moderna vaccine clinic on Wednesday, June 22nd from 9:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. in the Forest County Health Department. You must be 18 years or older to receive a Moderna vaccine. This clinic will be [by appointment only](#), so please call 715-478-3371 to schedule your time slot.

Northern Lake Service to allow employees to buy in to company

Northern Lake Service has anchored the north end of Crandon's business district for over 40 years, and its owners are determined to keep it that way for future generations. After several years of counselling and consideration, sibling owners, R.T. Krueger, Jeff Krueger and Greta Krueger-Williams have begun offering ownership to NLS staff, encouraging employee buy-in over the next few years.

The company was founded by the Kruegers' parents, Ron and Winnie, in 1974 and has since grown into one of the most highly-certified environmental compliance laboratories in Wisconsin, serving clients across the country.

"As we considered a long-term transition of ownership, we realized that the only way our conditions would be met is to have the business in the hands of the people who have helped us build it," says Jeff, who is also vice-president and part owner of another highly successful business in Forest County.

"We want to create a comfortable, controlled process (to transition ownership)" says R.T., who has served as president of NLS since 2000. "We want it to be slow enough that we maintain stability yet create momentum and interest of eligible employees. We know we could sell to one of the big guys (large network laboratories), but we also know that they are unlikely to have the commitment to our customers and our community. This transition will help ensure our continued success right here where we started."

R.T. went on, "I went through school with these people same class from second grade to graduation with one. I was in Boy Scouts with our IT manager. I was on the same Homecoming court with one of our main client service reps and our other rep was miniature princess on my Prom court! We've grown as people and as a company together." R.T. will remain in his position as president.

NLS performs testing of drinking water, wastewater, groundwater and many other matrices for compliance with State and Federal regulations. The lab directly serves over half of the municipalities in Wisconsin, all eleven federally-recognized Tribal communities in the State, and hundreds of private individuals and industrial customers, performing several tests, including analysis for PFAS compounds, that are not available from any other private laboratory in the State. Along with its headquarter facilities in Crandon, NLS also maintains a satellite laboratory in metropolitan Milwaukee (Waukesha). They employ 32 full-time staff and several student interns.

Ownership is available to full-time employees who have been with NLS for at least two years.

Rep. Swearingen is a strong advocate for lowering taxes, expanding broadband access district-wide, promoting tourism, and addressing the unique issues that only school districts in the Northwoods face.

"I am extremely humbled by the amount of support and encouragement I have received to run for a sixth term in the Assembly. As a restaurant owner, I understand firsthand the challenges our communities and businesses are facing with soaring gas prices and record-high inflation. I will continue working to keep property taxes low, help businesses get back on their feet, and get folks back to work. 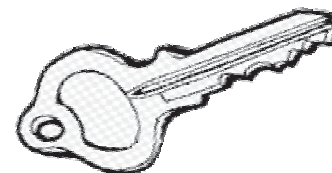

The Club and its members lead by our Founder John Newton, started doing this as a way to give back to Wabeno, and the community We want other people to come and enjoy the great town and natural beauty if the area.. Many members of the club have family and ties to the area, with others looking into purchasing, and renting places for themselves.

The route will begin at the fire fighters grounds in downtown Wabeno, and riders will be given a route map marking a pathway of over 250 miles of on-road and off-road terrain that registrants will follow. Many ride in small groups, and everyone is encouraged to ride at their own pace. To some that's stopping at several stream crossings to soak tired feet or take pictures of the flora & fauna, as well as just riding. There are different routes for each day, with Saturday sweeping east to Goodman for lunch at the Historic Goodman Club house and gas stops. and Sunday Breakfast will be handled by the BIG EASEL of Wabeno and the ride will be primarily east of Highway 32.

Riders preregister online, the sign-up fee includes 2 days of riding, 3 meals, camping at the Wabeno Firefighters' Grounds and an event tee shirt, but riders are encouraged to make a minimum donation of \$150 to the cause. And of course there are raffles at dinner Saturday night to add to the fun and donations.

After only 14 years the club will topple the \$225,000.00 mark of donations to the UW Carbone Cancer Center "That's an awesome accomplishment, given that our ride is relatively small compared to other cancer fundraisers." says Newton

According to the club, between both this event and the fall event also held in Wabeno, it is estimated that riders bring in \$50,000- \$60,000 worth of revenue to area businesses, which they hope helps stimulate the local economy.

While all donations from the Ride for Research go to the UW Carbone Cancer Center, during the fall event, the Big Woods 200 held the last 20 years in September, they have always given to local charities and causes that could use a hand, such as the Wabeno K-9 unit, the Wabeno Logging Museum, the Wabeno Library, the Firefighters Grounds the Wabeno VFW post, the Forest County ATV Assc., the Townsend Christian Food Pantry, and others.

In attempts to be courteous to everyone that is in the area enjoying the natural beauty in their own way, we make all the riders submit to a sound check before the event to ensure that they are quiet. All bikes are held to a 89decibel standard. So if you see our riders out there that weekend give them a wave.

Corporate talking points correctly state that these pesticides are regulated and approved for use by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), but that doesn't mean they are without any negative environmental consequences.

Pyrethroids are relatively safe but should not be viewed as harmless. If you spill enough on your skin you might experience itchiness, numbness, nausea, and respiratory problems, among a rather long list of adverse events. At very high doses pyrethroids can kill you, a fact known because some people have injected it (suicide) and in one case because somebody ate food that was cooked in pyrethroid concentrate (it resembles cooking oil).

There is no way for companies to spray these broad-spectrum insecticides in your yard without also killing other insects they come in contact with, including bees, butterflies, caterpillars, ladybugs, dragonflies and other beneficial insects, along with the mosquitoes.

How Sprays Hurt Bees and Other Wildlife

The focus of much of the toxicity testing by regulatory agencies has been on domesticated honey bees because their pollination services are critically important for our agriculture system and food production.

Researchers have documented widespread contamination of honey bee hives with toxic pyrethroids, finding residues of these chemicals in the pollen that bees bring back to the hive, in beeswax, and on bees themselves, at levels that can be lethal to bees or cause harmful effects.

Much less is known about the impacts of these sprays on wild insects and other native wildlife, but mosquito-control insecticides have been linked with declines of native pollinators. It's clear that wild native bees and other pollinators are also at risk from mosquito pesticides.

Recently, thousands of monarch butterflies were found dead in the Fargo-Moorhead area of North Dakota and Minnesota after aerial spraying of a 100-square mile area with permethrin to control mosquitoes. Monarch populations have plummeted at an alarming rate in recent decades.

Mosquitoes themselves play an ecological role, serving as pollinators and as a food source for other wildlife.

Are pyrethroids safe for pets?

Dogs and chickens seem to be fine. Cats, however, lack sufficient levels of a liver enzyme that helps detoxify pyrethroids and can thus develop what is called pyrethroid toxicosis. A good indicator of cat sensitivity to pyrethroids is the standard warning of keeping cats away from pyrethroid-treated dogs. I.e., if you dose your dog with a large amount of pyrethroids (to kill fleas, e.g.), cats that cuddle with the dog are at risk.

And then there are fish, which are acutely sensitive to pyrethroids. Franchise owners will generally avoid spraying near people's fish ponds and bodies of water. Indeed, by law pyrethroids can't be used near water, though there are many reports of franchises ignoring that regulation. Even if a property doesn't have a pond or stream, pyrethroids are rather stable in the soil and tend to get washed into nearby streams after rains. It is increasingly accepted that runoff of pyrethroids into creeks can kill fish downstream.

Is spraying effective?

Although spraying pyrethroids might be a good way to kill mosquitoes near the ground and in low shrubs, many mosquito species spend most of their time high up in the canopies of trees and are untouched by sprays. For example, many species in the genus Culex (transmitters of West Nile virus, St. Louis encephalitis, eastern equine encephalitis, western encephalitis, avian malaria, etc.) are tree dwellers and only occasionally come down to feed on humans and pets. This limitation isn't just theoretical: one study showed spraying didn't reduce numbers of Culex at all. So if you have trees and birds, don't expect that spraying will be effective.
