#### **Piers and Docks in Wisconsin**

Wisconsin is home to more than 15,000 lakes, making it an ideal place for water enthusiasts. Whether you're looking to fish, swim, or simply enjoy the stunning views, having a pier or dock is an essential part of lakeshore living. Here's some information regarding the various types of piers and docks available in Wisconsin, as well as the regulations governing their construction and

#### **Types of Piers and Docks**

There are several types of piers and docks available for use on Wisconsin's lakes. The most common types include:

Permanent Piers - These are designed to be a permanent fixture on the shoreline and are typically constructed using wood, concrete, or steel. They can be used for a variety of purposes, including swimming, fishing, and boating.

### High water fills the area

With a late and very big snow storm and then a quick thaw, water levels are high all over the area. This is the bridge over the Peshtigo in Cavour. The clump of trees on the right is the normal shoreline, and where you see water is mowed lawn in the warm months. The water was almost to the girders on the bridge. This is the main branch of the Peshtigo, so it is carrying the water from the North, Middle and South Branches of the Peshtigo River and Otter Creek as well as numerous other small streams.



The water actually fills the yard of the white house near the intersection in Cavour and has flooded one of the streets and part of the intersection. Anybody driving to the town hall or the east end of the village will get last winters salt washed off the bottom of their vehicle.



Anybody wishing to drive Lake Lucerne's East Shore Drive will find they can't complete the loop. This culvert washout just south of Pete Davison's house has closed the road. The big pond in the woods, on the left, is now happily draining into Lucerne without the restriction of a culvert.

According to Stephanie Statezny, in the county Office of Emergency Management, reports have been coming in of other culverts washed out on the Johnson Road and Bug Lake Road. There are likely more. Statezny said we should qualify for emergency disaster funds to help with the cost.

We should remember this spring when it is the end of July and you are watering the garden because it hasn't rained since the 4th of July Celebration.







'Learning to cope with stress and finding healthy ways to deal with stressful situations can go a long way towards living a healthy and positive life," says Simkins. "If your current go-to is to turn to unhealthy behaviors for coping with stress, such as smoking, overeating, or physical inactivity to identify a few examples, that's probably a good place to start making adjustments."

Next time you're feeling overwhelmed, try these stress busters from the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH) and American Heart Association (AHA): • Exercise and eat healthy . Get regular sleep . Avoid excess caffeine
