The Forest County Land & Water Department wrapped up another successful Plant Sale on Friday, June 2. Native plant orders went out in February and plants were ordered from Hansen's Greenhouse in Oneida County. In all about a dozen pre-orders were received. The plants ranged from native columbine, cardinal flowers to thimble berries.

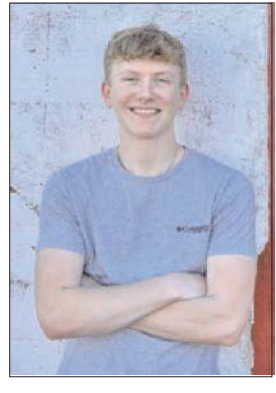

## Forest County Sheriff's Office performs criminal interdiction

On Friday, June 16, 2023, the Forest County Sheriff's Office performed an internal criminal interdiction where we had extra staff come in to perform traffic stops on vehicles that commit traffic violations in the Forest County area and look beyond the traffic stop for criminal behaviors such as possession of controlled substances, operating under the influence, outstanding warrants, stolen property, operating without a valid drivers' license, etc.

The staff consisted of deputies, the Forest County Drug Task Force and both K9's, Atlas and Thunder. This was a special detail operating from approximately noon until 8:00 p.m. and wages were completely funded by a grant.

During those 8 hours our deputies made 22 traffic stops resulting in 18 warnings being issued, 7 citations issued, and 13 people arrested for various criminal offenses.

The Forest County Sheriff's Office is committed to making Forest County a safer place for everyone to enjoy.

## A Historic Day for Wisconsin

On Wednesday, Senator Mary Felzkowski (R-Tomahawk) was successful in ushering her shared revenue bill - AB 245 - through the Senate, receiving a 21-12 bipartisan vote of approval. This comes on the heels of a Tuesday Joint Finance Committee session that saw historic investments in education and rural roads.

The shared revenue bill is a generational piece of legislation that revamps the way we fund local governments; incentivizes local innovation through efficiencies; repeals the Personal Property Tax; ensures our law enforcement, EMS, and fire fighters aren't defunded; limits the amount of time unelected local health

## -- Action Packed Racing Schedule to Highlight Weekend--

CRANDON, Wisconsin (June 13, 2023) -- After posting the most successful season in a storied 54 year-history last year, Crandon International Raceway is preparing to host the first major weekend of 2023 next weekend at the historic 30th Anniversary Forest County Potawatomi Crandon Brush Run races.

Honored with the 2022 "Facility of the Year" award presented by Speed Sport at December's annual PRI show, Crandon International Raceway will welcome back its loyal racer and fan base to the 400-acre "Big House" June 23 - 25, 2023. Three action-packed days of practice qualifying and racing as part of the 2023 AMSOIL Champ Off-Road Series presented by U.S. Air Force will be a highlight of the event, including the Forest County Potawatomi Community Cup finale

Festivities kick off Friday, June 23rd at 1:30 p.m. with 18 sessions of Pro and Sportsman category practice, followed at 5:30 p.m. by Pro class qualifying for trucks, buggies and SxS classes. Fans wanting to enjoy the 2023 kick-off are encouraged to come for no admission or parking fees courtesy of Forest County Potawatomi and Crandon International Raceway. Crandon's "Free Friday" begins with gates opening to the public at 9:00 a.m.

As is Crandon tradition, the 2023 schedule will kick-off with the 30th anniversary Forest County Potawatomi Brush Run races, taking place Saturday, June 24th through Sunday, June 25th. Gates of Camp Crandon will opening for weekend camping at 12:00 noon (CST) on Thursday, June 22nd. The popular weekend will feature more than 250 racers competing in 36 rounds of competition for all Pro and Sportsman categories that make up the AMSOIL Champ Off-Road Series. Race fans can expect large and highly competitive fields of truck, buggy and UTV classes, including the spectacular Pro 4, Pro 2, Pro Lite and Pro Spec category trucks.

The weekend concludes on Sunday afternoon with the prestigious 30th anniversary Crandon Forest County Potawatomi Community Cup race, an all-out competition that pits Pro 2 and Pro 4 racers on the track at the same time with a staggered start. Racers will be competing for a total Community Cup purse of \$30,000, with the winner taking home a \$12,000 cash prize and a prominent place in Crandon history. Last year CJ Greaves drove his Monster Energy-backed Toyota to a hugely popular victory.

To help celebrate the special weekend track officials have added a bonus prize purse of \$12,000 cash to be spread among the Pro category classes and an additional \$10,000 for Sportsman racers -- good for a grand total of \$52,000 in cash prizes contributed directly by Crandon International Raceway and the Forest County Potawatomi to the racing community.


without raising your taxes a single penny."

The shared revenue bill was wrapped into an agreed upon package with the Governor that also included historic funding in education. Sen. Felzkowski and her Joint Finance Committee colleagues addressed these education increases, as well as crucial rural road funding investments in a JFC hearing on Tuesday night.

The Committee voted in favor of education motions that maintain two-thirds funding for public schools, with more than \$1 billion in new spendable resources; invest \$50 million in literacy programs and \$30 million in mental health; provide 33.3% of special education and 45% of high cost special education; expand choice and charter school funding by \$280 million; and increase payments for sparsity aid and high cost transportation, which is vital for our district.

The Committee also approved transportation motions that invest an additional \$1.55 billion, including \$362 million in local roads and bridges, \$386 million in state highways, and \$150 million in a new Ag Road Improvement Program (ARIP) that will provide funding to upgrade local roads and bridges, which are the critical link between farmers, their fields, processing facilities, and the businesses that provide essential feed and supplies - which includes the forestry industry.

"Overall, we've had two extremely successful and historic days for northern Wisconsin, and the state as a whole. We've all been sent to Madison with the purpose of working together to find solutions that benefit our entire state - and the past couple of days prove that it can be done. I look forward to the Governor signing shared revenue into law, and following it up with a signature on the budget bill, when that process is complete."

**Baldwin, Cassidy Introduce Bill to Stop China from Exploiting Loophole that Undercuts U.S. Manufacturers, Allows Fentanyl in U.S.**

Trade tax loophole has allowed China and other countries to import cheap products made by slave labor or illicit drugs into the U.S. without proper inspection

U.S. Senators Tammy Baldwin (D-WI) and Bill Cassidy, M.D. (R-LA) introduced the De Minimis Reciprocity Act of 2023 to close a trade loophole that is allowing China and other countries to undercut American manufacturers, let products made by slave labor get in the hands of U.S. consumers, and bring in illicit drugs like fentanyl into the country. Currently, small-dollar imports with a value of less than \$800 are allowed into the U.S. duty-free and with little customs scrutiny. However, the \$800 de minimis threshold, or the value under which duties are waived, has been abused, letting China send hundreds of billions of dollars worth of products into the U.S. market, undermining U.S. manufacturers and letting illicit substances into our communities.

The bipartisan De Minimis Reciprocity Act of 2023 would bar Chinese imports from exploiting customs procedures that allow duty-free entry into the U.S. Additionally, the bill would reduce the de minimis thresholds for other trade partners to levels that match their policy for U.S. exports to their country.

"A trade loophole is allowing Chinese companies to import goods in the U.S. with no oversight - letting them bring in cheap, counterfeit goods that undercut American manufactures and traffic drugs into our communities," said Senator Baldwin. "Our bipartisan bill will close this loophole to create a level playing field for our Made in America manufactures, curb illicit drugs like fentanyl from coming into the country, and help ensure Americans are not supporting goods made with forced labor."

"Our customs laws are outdated, and China is taking advantage of that by importing billions of dollars of cheap goods into the U.S. with no oversight," said Dr. Cassidy. "This bill will allow U.S. manufacturers to compete fairly for U.S. store shelves and counter those who wish to use our trade system to launder money or smuggle counterfeits and drugs."

The legislation is cosponsored by Senator JD Vance (R-OH).

The De Minimis Reciprocity Act would also:

- Exclude untrustworthy countries from using the 'trusted' de minimis channel.
- Only allow express carriers to facilitate de minimis imports into the U.S. to help better at stop counterfeits and fentanyl at the border.
- Require more information on every package entering the U.S.
- Use the revenue proceeds to establish a fund for reshoring industry from China.

department officials can shut down businesses and places of worship without a vote of their governing body; gives Milwaukee the tools to address their unfunded pension liabilities; puts guard rails on the City of Milwaukee and Milwaukee County to ensure they don't end up back in this same financial situation; and much more.

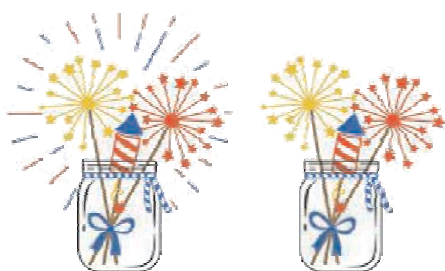
To the Editor,

**June is Mens' Health Month**

**Half of the men who die suddenly of coronary artery disease and heart attacks have had no previous symptoms.**

Every June, Men's Health Month is observed to raise awareness of the most preventable health problems that affect men. With studies showing that women are twice as likely to go to the doctor as men, it is important to encourage men to participate more in their overall wellness to detect and address health problems earlier, when they are most treatable.

Scheduling an annual wellness exam is a simple place to start. Men can make a significant impact on their health by regularly seeing their doctor and participating in the right screenings. Your age, personal and family medical history, lifestyle, and other factors will help determine the schedule.

"When you see your doctor annually, you can be sure to get the screening tests that are right for you," said Aspirus Cardiologist Dr. Daniel Krause. "Blood pressure and cholesterol checks are important for almost every man over age 20. But as men get older, checks for prostate and colon cancer are recommended as well as screenings for diabetes."

Men should also know that heart disease is still the leading cause of death in the United States, causing about one in every four male deaths. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the percent of men aged 20 and over with hypertension is 51.9 percent and the same group has a 40.5 percent incidence of obesity. Both are contributing factors for developing heart disease.

"Heart disease can be silent and undiagnosed until serious symptoms emerge, causing a heart attack or heart failure," said Dr. Krause. "Half of the men who die suddenly of coronary artery disease and heart attacks have had no previous symptoms. We need to be addressing conditions like hypertension, high cholesterol, diabetes, and obesity early for men. We need to focus on prevention of heart disease before it occurs."

Another common cardiovascular condition that can seriously raise the risk of heart attack or stroke is Peripheral Artery Disease (PAD), caused by plaque buildup (atherosclerosis) in the arteries. Men may mistake their foot or leg pain as a normal part of aging, from arthritis or overuse. But these symptoms may be related to the plaque clogged arterial passages of PAD.

"PAD is a strong warning that atherosclerosis may be present in other blood vessels, such as those supplying the heart or brain. Atherosclerosis in those locations could lead to heart attack or stroke," said Dr. Krause. "If you are experiencing ongoing pain in your legs, don't ignore it. Talk to your doctor to see if you should be screened for PAD."

Men should know that it is never too late to start improving their health. They can increase their chance of living longer, and better, by adopting simple health-promoting strategies. By seeing their doctor regularly, eating right, staying active, watching their weight, not smoking, and not ignoring mental health they can enjoy a healthier, more meaningful life.

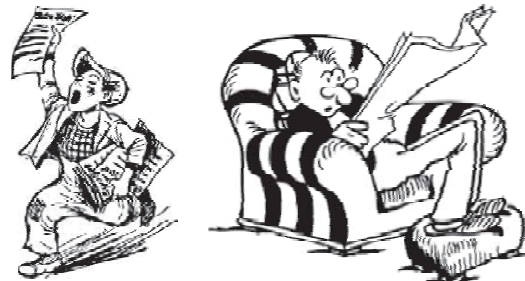

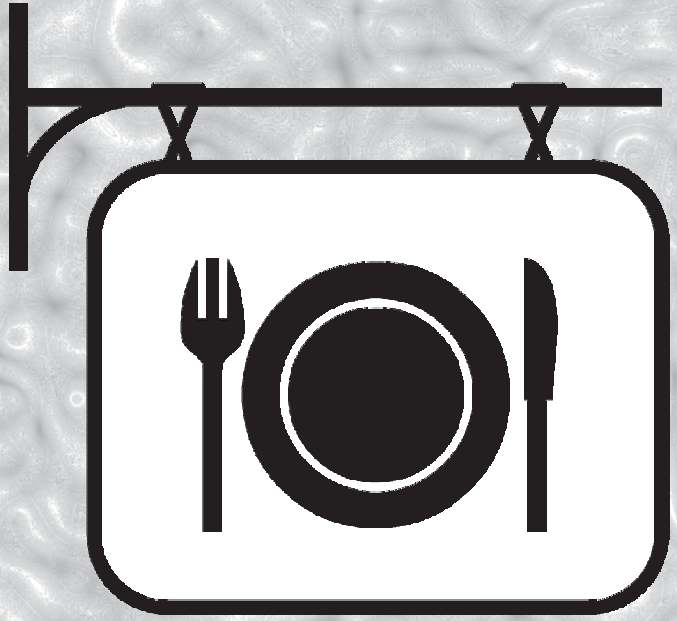

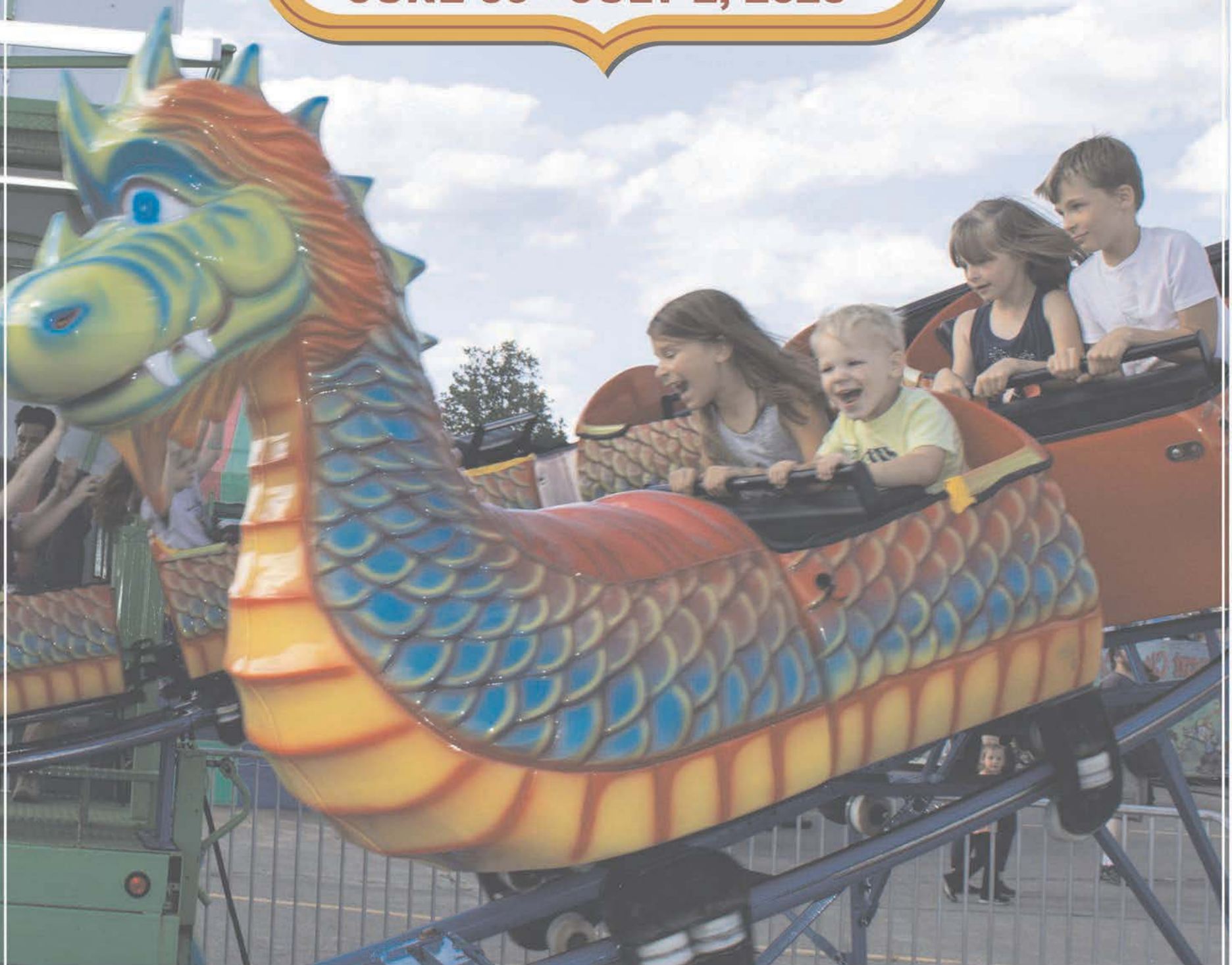
