#### Forest County's Triumph in Boat Landing Projects with **WDNR Grant Funding**

Nashville, a small town nestled in the heart of Forest County, Wisconsin, has recently achieved a significant milestone in its ongoing efforts to enhance recreational opportunities for its residents and visitors. Through a strategic partnership between the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) and the Town of Nashville, the Pickerel Lake North and South Boat Landings, along with the Crane Lake Boat Landing, have been successfully completed. These projects represent a collaborative endeavor, combining WDNR grant funding and Town of Nashville resources, to improve public access to the area's pristine waters.

Pickerel Lake, known for its crystal-clear waters

infrastructure presented safety concerns. Recognizing the need for improvement, the Town of Nashville, led by Curt Haga, embarked on a mission to revamp the Pickerel Lake North and South Boat Landings.

The success of these projects was made possible through a collaborative effort that involved Forest County Land & Water assisting with securing WDNR grant funding and leveraging the Town of Nashville's resources. The grant funds provided crucial financial support, while the town contributed additional resources and manpower.

Improvements at the Pickerel Lake North and South Boat Landings included:

Enhanced Access: The boat landings were upgraded with new concrete landing pads to provide safer and more accessible points of entry to Pickerel Lake, ensuring that residents and tourists can enjoy the lake with ease. In recent years, a large 'motor loading' hole had developed at the end

Krueger & Steinfest, Inc. installed the new pads and filled the 'hole' with rip rap to hopefully, deter motor loading in the future.

Environmental Stewardship: Careful attention was given to preserving the natural beauty of Pickerel Lake. Measures were taken to minimize environmental impact during construction and protect the local ecosystem.

Amenities: The upgraded facilities now feature amenities such as improved parking areas enhancing the overall experience for lake enthusiasts.

The Crane Lake Boat Landing project shared similar goals with those of Pickerel Lake but was tailored to meet the unique needs of the community surrounding Crane Lake. With a grant from WDNR and the Town of Nashville's support, the transformation of the Crane Lake Boat Landing has been a resounding success.

Key highlights of the Crane Lake Boat Landing project include:

Accessibility: The new boat landing provides more convenient access to Crane Lake, enabling boaters, anglers, and recreational users to enjoy the lake to its fullest.

Safety Measures: Safety enhancements, including improved lighting and signage, have been integrated into the landing, ensuring a secure environment for all visitors.

Community Engagement: Local residents played an active role in shaping the project's design and priorities, creating a sense of ownership and pride in the finished product.

These projects not only address immediate infrastructure needs but also promote economic growth and community well-being by attracting tourists and outdoor enthusiasts. As Nashville and Forest County continue to invest in their natural assets, the future looks bright, with even more opportunities for residents and visitors to enjoy the great outdoors.

### FCAL holds Environmental Field Day for area students

There were various stations, and the students were split into groups and assigned about 20 minutes per station.

The students were presented with a variety of topic. R.T. Krueger covered the macroinvertebrates that occur in the waters of Forest County. Jeannie Fannin covered the topic of shoreland zoning. A pontoon tour of Lake Metonga searched for Eurasian Milfoil. Jamie Anderson did a presentation on surveying, and the Wild Rivers Invasive Species Coalition covered invasive species. Sherry Pethers did the Loon Watch topic, and Dr. Jim Zach presented the History of the Earth.

There were students from Wabeno, Laona and Crandon, with 16 attending from Wabeno, 26 students attending from Laona, and 12 students from Crandon.



MADISON, Wis. - The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) today announced the release of its 2023 Air Quality Trends Report.

The annual report includes state monitoring data through 2022 for air pollutants regulated under the federal Clean Air Act, including ground-level ozone, particle pollution, sulfur dioxide, nitrogen dioxide and carbon monoxide. While concentrations of these pollutants have decreased over the last two decades, in recent years the report shows two of the most harmful pollutants - ozone and fine particulates - have decreased only modestly in recent years.

The 2023 report shows that since the early 2000s, statewide ozone concentrations have decreased 21%. With these reductions, the entire state is meeting the federal 2008 ozone standard. However, with only modest improvements, and even slight concentration increases along the Lake Michigan shoreline in recent years, the Milwaukee area and parts of Sheboygan and Kenosha counties are not meeting the more stringent 2015 ozone standard.

"Wisconsin has implemented many programs that have reduced emissions of ozone-causing pollutants from power plants, industry and transportation in the state," said Gail Good, DNR Air Management Program Director. "However, these emission reductions have not resulted in attainment because most sources of ozonecausing emissions are outside of the state's control."

As part of a massive air quality research campaign, the DNR partnered with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and several universities to better understand ozone formation chemistry and emission sources driving ozone formation.


'The Wisconsin Air Management program is thrilled to be just one part of this unprecedented national air quality study to better understand the public health threat pollutants like ozone create," said Katie Praedel, DNR's Air Monitoring Section Chief. "These efforts will help states in the Lake Michigan region identify emission control strategies that will lead to air quality improvements and cleaner air for Wisconsin residents to breathe."

To better illustrate the latest trends, the DNR updated the interactive StoryMap which shows Wisconsin's air quality trends for each pollutant over the last 20 years. This tool, first launched with last year's trends report, provides a more user-friendly visual way to convey complex air quality data.

The 2023 trends report also includes updated national emissions inventory data through 2020. The data show that emissions of most directly emitted pollutants or their precursors have decreased substantially since 2002. Highlights from this data include:

A 72% decrease in reported emissions of nitrogen oxides (NOx) and a 28% decrease in volatile

organic compounds (VOCs) - key ingredients that form ground-level ozone.

Emissions of sulfur dioxide (SO2) decreased by 93%, with the largest reductions coming from the electric utility fuel combustion sector.

Emissions of carbon monoxide (CO) decreased by 58%, with most of the reductions coming from highway vehicles and the off-highway sector.



# Help slow the spread of CWD this season: avoid baiting and feeding deer

MADISON, Wis. – The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) reminds hunters and the public to help prevent the spread of chronic wasting disease (CWD) by following all baiting and feeding bans and refraining from baiting and feeding in areas where no bans are in effect.

CWD is an always-fatal disease that affects the nervous system of deer, elk, moose and caribou caused by a misshapen prion protein. The disease can spread through contact with an infected animal's saliva, urine or feces. It can also spread indirectly through exposure to a contaminated environment. CWD prions are extremely resilient, and they can stay in the soil for a long time, making containment of an affected area a challenge.

Baiting is the intentional placement of any material, including food, scented materials, salts, minerals and grains, to attract wild animals for hunting purposes. Feeding is the deliberate placement of material used to feed or attract wild animals for non-hunting purposes, including recreational and supplemental feeding, except as allowed for birds and small mammals.

Baiting and feeding encourage deer to congregate unnaturally around a specific location, creating an environment where infected deer can quickly spread diseases like CWD through direct contact with healthy deer.

Infected deer can also leave behind infectious CWD prions in their saliva, blood, feces and urine, creating a risk to healthy deer that visit the site in the future. CWD can spread rapidly when these prions remain in an area where more deer are sure to congregate, such as a feed pile.

To mitigate these risks and slow the spread of CWD, state law directs the DNR to impose baiting and feeding bans within any county with a confirmed CWD-positive deer.

Counties fall under a 3-year baiting and feeding ban when a wild or farm-raised deer tests positive for CWD in the county. If the CWD-positive deer is found within 10 miles of a county line, the adjoining county will fall under a two-year ban. If additional CWD cases are found during the lifetime of a baiting and feeding ban, the ban will reset for an additional two to three years.

Baldwin Calls out NFL's poor scheduling that leaves Packers Fans High and Dry, and reintroduces Go Pack Go Act

Ahead of conflicting Packers, Vikings, and Lions games this weekend, Baldwin rallies support for guaranteeing Packers broadcast for all Wisconsinites

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Today, U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin (D-WI) re-introduced her Go Pack Go Act, legislation to ensure all Wisconsinites can watch Green Bay Packers game broadcasts. Baldwin's Go Pack Go Act requires cable and satellite providers to provide their Wisconsin subscribers with access to programming from broadcast television stations in a Wisconsin media market.

Senator Baldwin also called on the National Football League (NFL) to take better care of Packers fans when scheduling games and help ensure they are able to watch the Green and Gold. The ask of the NFL comes as the Green Bay Packers, Minnesota Vikings, and Detroit Lions are all scheduled to play at the same time this weekend, leaving Packers fans in Western and Northern Wisconsin in jeopardy of being unable to access the Packers broadcast.

"As the only NFL team owned by the fans, the Green Bay Packers are beloved by Wisconsinites in every corner of our state. But on weeks like this one, where the Vikings and Lions are playing at the same time, thousands of Packers fans in Wisconsin could be denied the chance to see their team play," said Senator Baldwin. "I'm proud to again introduce the Go Pack Go Act because every Packers fan across our state should be able to watch every Packers game. But, until that happens, I am calling on the NFL to do a better job scheduling games and help ensure every Wisconsinite that bleeds Green and Gold is able to watch their Green Bay Packers."

In Wisconsin, more than 415,000 people live in 13 counties that have been assigned to an out-of-state market, in either Minnesota or Michigan. As a result, Wisconsinites in these counties cannot receive some, or any, TV broadcast stations based in Wisconsin. These Wisconsin residents may therefore lack access to programming most relevant to their Wisconsin communities – such as local news, information about local and state government, and sports. This means Green Bay Packers fans in 13 Wisconsin counties may end up with Minnesota Vikings or Detroit Lions games, not Packers games, when those teams are playing at the same time.

The Go Pack Go Act would require cable and satellite providers to provide their Wisconsin subscribers with access to programming from broadcast television stations in a Wisconsin media market. These local broadcasts may be more relevant to their daily lives and help them stay informed and entertained by Wisconsin-focused programming, including Packers games.

Packers fans in the following Wisconsin counties would benefit from Senator Baldwin's Go Pack Go Act: Ashland, Bayfield, Douglas, Iron and Sawyer Counties in the Duluth-Superior media market; Barron, Burnett, Dunn, Polk, Pierce, St. Croix, and Washburn Counties in the Twin Cities media market; and Florence County in the Marquette, Michigan media market.

Ahead of this week's NFL games, which has the Packers, Lions, and Vikings all kicking off at the same time, Senator Baldwin also sent a letter to NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell to urge the league to consider how scheduling these teams simultaneously impacts Packers fans.

"Wisconsinites love the Green Bay Packers, and when we can't be at Lambeau Field, we watch them play on TV," wrote Senator Baldwin. "Due to scheduling conflicts and local television markets that mismatch our State's border, however, nearly half of a million Wisconsin residents can receive the wrong broadcast when the Packers play at the same time as a neighboring football franchise. I urge the NFL to take additional care in its scheduling to avoid these conflicts and ensure every Wisconsinite can watch regular Packers broadcasts."

This season, the NFL's schedule includes four instances in which the Packers are scheduled to play at the same time and on the same network as these teams. These conflicts disappoint fans and are avoidable. I know that Green Bay Packers fans are the most loyal in the nation. The NFL should reward that loyalty with better scheduling practices to ensure they can watch the Packers, not the Vikings or Lions.

My Go Pack Go Act would solve this problem once and for all by requiring cable and satellite providers to give their Wisconsin subscribers access to programming from the broadcast television stations in a Wisconsin media market, and I will continue to fight for its passage. Until then, the NFL should take better care of Green Bay Packers fans by avoiding these conflicts in the first place. On behalf of the thousands of Packers fans in these affected counties, thank you for your prompt attention to this matter.






