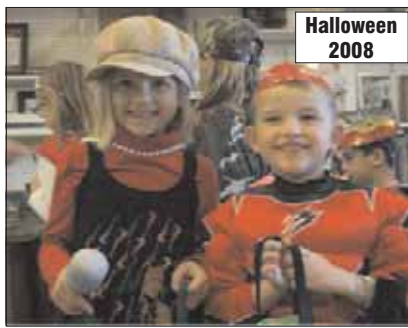

Conservation Corner

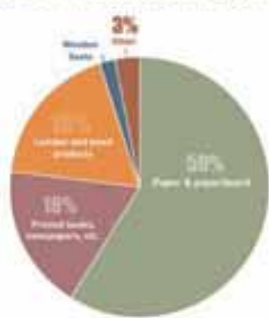

National Forest Products Week: Celebrating Wisconsin's Natural Heritage

Last week was National Forest Products Week. Since 1960, Americans have celebrated Forest Products during this week. Wisconsin is a major contributor to the Forest Products market. Wisconsin's forest products industry contributes around \$24 billion in goods and services and provides almost \$7 billion in value-added output. On top of the monetary contribution to the state's economy, the industry accounts for about 4% of state employment and represents almost 11% of total manufacturing jobs. In 31 counties, including Forest County, the forest products industry is one of the top ten employers. Every 100 jobs in the forest products industry sector support an additional 123 jobs in the other sectors of the economy.

TOP WISCONSIN FOREST PRODUCT EXPORTS



The Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC) reports that Wisconsin continues to be the #1 papermaking state in the U.S., shipping almost \$14 billion worth of paper annually. The forest products sector directly employs over 63,000 people. Wisconsin's forest products sector accounted for about 7% of the state's exports in 2018. These exports traveled to a total of 117 countries around the world.

According to an article from the Wisconsin Woodland Owners Association (WVOA), Wisconsin exported forest products worth \$1.5 billion across all categories in 2018. These exports make up a significant portion of Wisconsin's total exports: between 6 and 8% every year for the past two decades. The majority of these

Nearly \$50M in grants available to help Forest Products economy

Milwaukee, Wisc. (Oct. 18, 2023) – The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Forest Service is making nearly \$50 million in grant funding available for projects that support crucial links between healthy forests, strong rural economies and jobs in the forestry sector.

Made possible by the Inflation Reduction Act and Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, the funding will spark innovation, create new markets for wood products and renewable wood energy, expand processing capacity and help tackle the climate crisis.

"Our region relies on a strong forest products industry to improve forest resiliency and wildlife habitat, while supporting local economies and creating jobs, said Eastern Region Deputy Regional Forester Bob Lueckel. "Through these grants, we are directly supporting the tribes, organizations and businesses that are finding innovative ways to grow markets for forest products, store carbon in our buildings and infrastructure and provide firewood to those who need it."

The funding is through three key grant programs: Wood Innovations Grants, Community Wood Grants and Wood Products Infrastructure Assistance Grants. The Forest Service is seeking proposals that support innovative uses of wood in the construction of low-carbon buildings, as a renewable energy source and in manufacturing and processing products. These programs also provide direct support to expand and retrofit wood energy systems and wood products manufacturing facilities.

exports are paper and paperboard (\$890 million, or 59%). Printed books, newspapers and manuscripts make up 18%, and lumber and wood products also 18%. Wood pulp and furniture make up the balance of the exports. Canada and China are the top destinations for Wisconsin wood products.

The WWOA article went on to explain that Wisconsin's strong forest products industry is supported by a number of University of Wisconsin educational and research facilities to help keep Wisconsin's forests healthy, create innovative uses of wood fiber, and provide career opportunities:

- UW-Stevens Point's forestry program includes majors in ecosystem restoration and management, forest management, forest recreation, urban and community forestry, and wildland fire science. The forestry majors are accredited by the Society of American Foresters.

- UWSP's paper science and chemical engineering program focuses on improving the environmental performance and sustainability of large-scale industrial processes. The program's process engineering laboratory is home to the world's fastest student-run paper machine.

- Wisconsin Institute for Sustainable Technology (WIST) at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point provides research, laboratory services and education for business and industry, bringing new ideas and innovation from the university to the private sector.

- UW-Madison's forestry program offer a forestry science major and the Department of Forest and Wildlife Ecology offers two distinct graduate programs, MS and PhD degrees in Forestry. The Forest Science major is accredited by the Society of American Foresters.

- Northcentral Technical College's Wood Technology Center of Excellence in Antigo is a one-of-a-kind facility that offers the only wood science associate degree program in North America, and also offers a technical diploma in wood technology and a certificate program in CNC router operation.

He never met a stranger, especially one wearing a military hat, and would stop to talk to all of them.

All through his life he loved playing basketball. He was always on a team anywhere he went and was selected to the U.S. Army basketball team as well. Once his formal basketball play days had ended, he loved to play in the driveway or with the inmates during his time working in the prison system. Even later on, you would find him shooting baskets during the halftime of his grandsons' games.

Will loved to joke with everyone and make everyone feel at ease. As he aged, he simply enjoyed watching the birds and deer venture into the backyard while sitting on the porch with his wife and son, Lenny.

He was a family man and loved the Lord with all his heart. Will found his Savior later in life realizing that we have a loving God who forgives our sins through our trust in his son, Jesus Christ. Learning this brought a new attitude towards life realizing what a gift he had received. He was baptized at Alameda Baptist Church in Norman, OK. He touched many lives and was loved by so many. He fought hard all of his life to ensure his family was taken care of and he fought his cancer just as hard. He would not want us to be sad, but to rejoice in the fact that he has been made new and whole and is now with God and his family in Heaven.

He was preceded in death by his father and mother and brother Bill.

He is survived by his wife of 53 years, Janice; son David and his wife Karen, son Chris and his wife Liz, and son Lenny; daughter Hollie and her husband James Floyd; 4 grandsons, John and Joshua Schultz; Brett Schultz, and Connor Floyd; 3 granddaughters, Brigitte and Breanna Schultz and Abigail Floyd; and his sisters and brother in laws Don and Kay Crites and Gary and Barbara DuFour and a host of nieces, nephews and friends.

School Bus Safety

Follow Wisconsin's school bus laws to keep students safe-School Bus Safety Week reminds drivers of laws to protect children

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation urges drivers to understand and follow the laws designed to protect children at the bus stop during School Bus Safety Week. The national campaign, from October 16-20, 2023, encourages safe driving around buses and is an opportunity to educate families on how children can stay safe.

There are about 600 crashes involving school buses every year in Wisconsin. School buses are typically the safest way for students to get to school. Children are most at risk when they're not on the bus.

"As students cross the street to get to the bus stop, and while they get on and off the bus, they are in greater danger because they may be harder to see by the bus driver or others on the roads. That's when tragedies are most likely to happen," Wisconsin State Patrol Motor Carrier Enforcement Capt. Karl Mittelstadt said. "When you see a yellow bus, know that children are likely nearby and you need to be very careful."

Requirements to protect children

When a school bus stops to drop off or pick up passengers, other drivers are required by law to stop too. Buses are also equipped with flashing warning lights and stop arms to signal to drivers that they need to stop, but they're not always followed.

On one school day this year, bus drivers in Wisconsin reported 256 incidents of other vehicles illegally passing their school buses, according to a survey by the National Association of State Directors of Pupil Transportation Services.

When passed illegally, bus drivers are authorized to report violations to law enforcement. A citation for failure to stop for a school bus costs \$326 and four demerit points.

Wisconsin law requires drivers to use extra caution around school buses to protect students:

- Stop at least 20 feet away from a bus when red warning lights are flashing; the only exception is if you are traveling on the other side of a divided road
- Slow down when amber lights are flashing, which signal the bus is about to stop and red lights will soon be activated; drivers can pass a bus with amber lights activated but should do so cautiously
- Yield to pedestrians who have a walk signal or green light, or those who are crossing a road with no signals
- Always follow directions from school crossing guard

School buses are designed to be the safest vehicles on the roads. The chance of injury in a crash is lower than other passenger vehicles due to the construction of the bus. Plus, they are the only type of vehicle with a specific color required by law. The yellow paint allows for high visibility.

The Wisconsin State Patrol works to ensure the equipment on every Wisconsin school bus is working properly to safely transport children. Inspectors conduct about 10,000 inspections each year, looking at mechanical equipment like steering, brakes and exits, first aid kits and fire extinguishers.

Bus stop safety

School bus drivers are some of the most highly trained vehicle operators on the roads. They receive special driver training and education on how to keep kids safe as they're loading and unloading the bus. Drivers must pass the Commercial Driver License (CDL) exam with a school bus endorsement.

While the main job of bus drivers is to protect children, parents should also talk with their kids about how to be safe getting to and from the bus stop.

Children should always:

- Look both ways before crossing the street
- Follow instructions from bus drivers and crossing guards
- Stay at least three, big steps away from the curb when waiting for the bus; wait until the bus comes to a complete stop and the driver says it's safe to get on the bus
- Make sure the bus driver can see them when crossing in front of the bus; stay at least five, big steps away and look both ways for other traffic

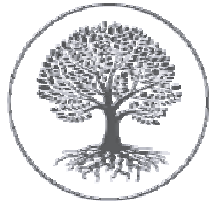

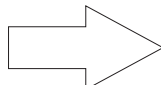

Eligible entities in the private, nonprofit and government sectors include tribes, local and state governments, businesses and for-profit entities and institutions of higher education, as well as public utility, fire, conservation, and school districts, among others. Businesses that are engaged in or support the forest products economy are eligible to apply for funding to expand manufacturing capacity.

These investments will support forest management projects to improve forest health and reduce wildfire risk across all land ownerships. Byproducts of these activities, like small-diameter timber and woody biomass, have historically been of little market value. Thanks in part to these Forest Service grant programs, funding is available to support the use of this often-unused material in many types of wood products.

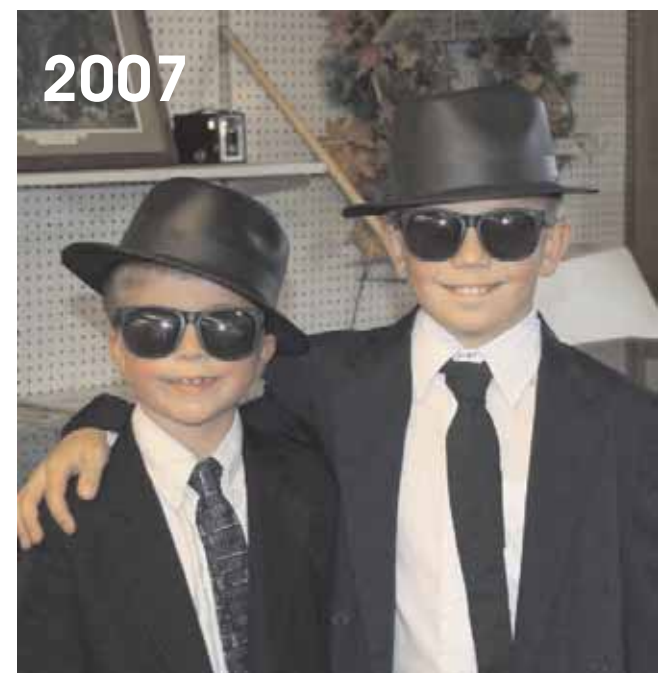
