Crandon International set to kick-off 2024 after record setting season

Crandon International Raceway is gearing up for an electrifying season, building on the success of a historic 2023 marked by record-breaking crowds and competitors, stellar races, and expanded corporate partnerships.

As is Crandon tradition, the race season kicks off early next week as race enthusiasts can secure their Camp Crandon campsite and Grandstand seat reservations for the 2024 Forest County Potawatomi Brush Run (June 21 - 23) on Monday March 4, 2024, at noon (CST).

Fans with Brush Run camp reservations will then get exclusive access to reserve Camp Crandon sites and grandstands seats for the Polaris Crandon World Championships/Red Bull Cup (Aug. 29 - Sept. 1) from Monday, March 18 at noon (CST) through Sunday, March 24.

On Monday, March 25 at noon (CST) reservations for the World Championship weekend will be open to all. Last year, reservations for Camp Crandon on Labor Day weekend were sold-out six months in advance – also a new Crandon record.

2024 Forest County Conservation Poster Contest

Last week we highlighted the local winners of our conservation poster contest. The theme for the 2024 Poster Contest this year was "May the Forest be With You, Always." The Poster Contest was open to kindergarten through 12th grade students, and posters were evaluated on the following criteria: Conservation message, Visual effectiveness, Originality, Universal appeal, and Individual artwork.

The students who took 1st Place at the local level advanced to the Area Contest, which was hosted in Oneida County on February 6, 2024. The North Central Land and Water Conservation Association consists of 9 area counties.

We had three students place at the Area Contest. They were Jayden Seiler (2nd place) and Madelyne Tilton (1st Place) from Laona. We had one student from Crandon place at the Area Contest and that was Aria Peterson (2nd Place).

It was an exciting weekend of wrestling action in Madison, Wisconsin as the state's top high school wrestlers competed for a chance at a state championship title. Crandon sent four wrestlers to compete including the first female qualifier, Samara Alloway.

The action kicked off Thursday night at the Kohl Center in exciting fashion. Alloway went down to the #1 seed in her bracket by pinfall, while Dewing defeated Marathon's Cale Quaintance by decision (8-2). Palubicki was able to knock off Dominic Caylor, a senior from Oconto, by pinfall (3:47).

On the second day of competition and after receiving a first round bye, Elias Glinski was defeated by Reid Sawyer of New Lisbon by decision (3-2) but later defeated Dylan Dodson of Marathon by decision (9-2), which guaranteed him a spot on the podium. In similar fashion, Palubicki fell to Kade Rule of Mineral Point, who went on to become the state champion at 165 pounds, by major decision (12-2), but then was victorious over the #3 seed Ethan Upson, a senior from Phillips, by pinfall (5:47) securing his place on the podium.

Lack of snow can qualify some businesses for Economic Injury Disaster Loans

Governor Evers and Senator Baldwin have announced that some businesses may be eligible for a federal disaster loan if they have suffered losses due to this year's unusually mild winter and lack of snowfall.

The lack of snow has impacted businesses that count on activities such as skiing, snowshoeing and snowmobiling.

Governor Evers and Senator Baldwin have been working with the Small Business Administration to ensure businesses in impacted counties are eligible for relief. Evers is encouraging businesses to apply for these loans as soon as possible.

The Legion is a regular donator to King Veteran's Home.

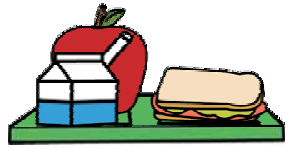
