#### **Purple Loosestrife Beetles in Forest County**



Northern Wisconsin is home to diverse ecosystems and natural landscapes that require conservation efforts to maintain their ecological balance. One of the challenges faced in this region is the invasion of non-native plant species, such as purple loosestrife

(Lythrum salicaria). This aggressive plant has the potential to disrupt native habitats and reduce biodiversity. Purple loosestrife is a perennial herbaceous plant native to Europe and Asia. It was introduced to North America in the 1800s and has since become a pervasive invasive species, particularly in wetland ecosystems. We have a few small patches in Forest County. It appears that the Purple Loosestrife is mainly found on the eastern side of our county along Hwy 32 from Carter to Laona and Hwy 8 north of Laona. There are a few solutions to mitigating and managing this invasive species. One solution is through implementing biological control methods, such as raising purple loosestrife beetles (Galerucella spp.). Purple Loosestrife beetles offer a promising solution to manage this invasive species while minimizing environmental impact.

Understanding the lifecycle of purple loosestrife beetles is crucial to their successful propagation. The beetles undergo four stages: egg, larva, pupa, and adult. Eggs are laid on the undersides of purple loosestrife leaves, and upon hatching, the larvae begin feeding on the plant's foliage. Pupation occurs on the stem or in the soil, and adult beetles emerge and continue to feed on purple



#### Kentuck Day and the Kentuck Car Show in Crandon, July 27



The Kentuck Car Show is always held in conjunction with the Kentuck Day Celebration in Crandon at the Courthouse Square. It is a way to give credit to the Kentucks who migrated here at around the turn of the century to the 1900's. It is a celebration of what the Kentucks migrating from Kentucky to cold northern Wisconsin did to help settle this wild place in northeast Wisconsin. They brought with them an urge to get ahead in an area that was just being developed into a timber economy and what was important to the incoming Kentucks was the availability of land that could be turned into farms.


There is always a lot of color involved with the invasion of the Kentucks to northeast Wisconsin and the Wolf River basin. The hillbilly concept is true to a point, but there were also some very entrepreneurial people that made the migration from the hills of Kentucky. For example, there was Doctor Ison, who built the building we use for the production of this newspaper. There was Luther Ison, who was a dentist and actually did some business in what is now one of our apartments upstairs, and later had a practice in Elcho. The Hotel Crandon was built by a Kentuck named Art McMillion. The story is that he didn't go broke during the Great Depression because the moonshine business carried him through. Of course, there are always rumors about Kentucks being involved in making and selling moonshine! And, actually, many of them were involved, as they brought the skills needed from Kentucky.

There are colorful stories, some of them likely true, but regardless, they helped build this community back in its early days. Kentuck Day helps us all remember not only their contribution to the community, but the local color as well.

The celebration will be on the courthouse square and up and down the street with participating businesses. The food will be good, the shopping will be too, and expect some great music in the courthouse square.

And don't forget the **Kentuck Day Car Show** across the street!

Be in Crandon on Saturday, July 27th with your booth, collectible car or just a desire to have a good time, to enjoy good food and drink, listen to good music and visit with friends! The events start at 10 a.m. and run until 3 p.m. There will be plenty of good food, fun activities, and so far, 85 vendors!





loosestrife. To establish a beetle population, adult beetles can be collected from areas where they are abundant or obtained from specialized suppliers. Care must be taken to ensure the beetles are not carrying any diseases or parasites. After collection, the beetles are released strategically in areas with purple loosestrife infestations, allowing them to disperse and feed on the invasive plants. Raising purple loosestrife beetles offers a sustainable and ecologically sound alternative to chemical herbicides. It reduces the use of harmful chemicals and minimizes the risk of collateral damage to non-target organisms. In the long run, biological control methods tend to be more cost-effective than repeated herbicide applications. Once established, the beetle population can persist and continue to suppress purple loosestrife without significant ongoing investment. By controlling purple loosestrife populations, the raised beetles help restore native plant diversity and promote the reestablishment of indigenous species. This, in turn, benefits wildlife by providing suitable habitats and food sources.

Embracing biological control methods encourages the preservation of native biodiversity while minimizing environmental impacts. By actively participating in these efforts, residents and conservation organizations can contribute to the restoration and protection of northern Wisconsin's natural habitats. Here in Forest County, we host two of the cages used to mass produce the purple loosestrife beetles. We work with area partners such as the FLOW AIS Coordinator (Forest, Langlade, Marinette, and Oconto Waterways Aquatic Invasive Species) Coordinator, as well as the WHIP Coordinator (Wisconsin Headwaters Invasives Partnership), Vilas County Land and Water Department, as well as staff from the WI DNR. It is a group effort to dig purple loosestrife plants from the known populations each spring, plant them into pots, and establish them in the cages. We then get beetles from already established beetle populations in the surrounding area to feed on our plants and reproduce. In Forest County, we have one site that we treated with purple loosestrife beetles in 2023. We released 130 more beetles at this location last week and there was feeding occurring from the 2023 release, which is a promising sign that those beetles overwintered well.

#### DMV offers info on obtaining ID for voting

Ahead of the Wisconsin Fall Primary, August 13, 2024, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) reminds U.S. citizens how to obtain identification, free of charge, that is valid for voting.

Valid identification for voting purposes, for those who will be at least 18 years of age by the next election, includes a driver license, identification card, military or student ID card, etc. There is no separate "voter ID." A federally compliant REAL ID card is not required for voting purposes. Anyone unsure if their identification or qualification meets the requirements should visit the Wisconsin Elections Commission website to check.

To obtain identification to show at the polls, begin online. A list of the required documents to bring to a DMV Customer Service Center is available at wisconsindmv.gov. If the required documents needed for an ID are not readily available, DMV has a process for U.S. citizens to obtain the necessary information. This process, available free of charge, may be used to quickly obtain a receipt valid to take to the polls for voting while the remaining documents or verifications are obtained.

Anyone with guestions related to obtaining an ID that can be used to vote should call DMV's toll-free hotline at (844) 588-1069. Questions regarding voter eligibility, poll locations, voter registration information or other election information can be directed to the Wisconsin Elections Commission at elections.wi.gov.

Start the application now at wisconsindmv.gov or at a local DMV Customer Service Center. To find a DMV, check hours, services and wait times, visit wisconsindmv.gov/centers.




