Lake Science Basics program at the LLAA Pavilion

You can learn more about lake science if you attend the LLAA Lake Science Basics presentation at the LLAA pavilion on County W this Saturday, August 17, from 9:30 to 11 a.m.

The presenter will be Ted Rulseh, author of three books about inland lakes and lake science, and is also the President of the Oneida County Lakes & Rivers Association.

The more you know about lakes, the better you can care for lake and better understand the lake science to help with your lake management plan.

Public Hearing at Lakewood Library to Address Oconto County Library Plan

An Oconto County Library Planning Committee established by the County Board has completed a final draft of the 2025-2029 County Library Plan. The new plan contains updated language as well as the funding formula for County support of its six libraries. Prior to adoption of the Plan by the Oconto County Board, state law requires public hearings. The last of three will be held at Lakes Country Public Library in Lakewood on August 20 at 5 p.m.

In 2024, Oconto County allocated \$457,035 to its six libraries plus \$157,000 as required reimbursement to out-of-county libraries for services provided to County residents not directly served by a local library. Most Wisconsin counties fund their libraries at 100% or more, but the proposed 2025 plan reduces Oconto County's allocation to \$421,329, a \$45,564 decrease that meets the statutory minimum of 70%. The resulting \$45,564 decrease must be made up by the municipalities that own the libraries. In the case of Lakes Country Public Library, that amount is \$10,344.

The proposed Plan is posted on the Oconto County website at www.co.oconto.wi.us/documentcenter/view/5618. Citizens are encouraged to read the Plan and attend the public hearing to ask questions and share their views.

Working on the Forest County Border Public Land Survey System

A few weeks ago, our County Surveyor and I spent the day working on the Marinette and Forest County Border south of Armstrong Creek. We have about thirteen Public Land Survey System (PLSS) monumented corners that need to get updated along this line to help finish updating the entire Forest County Border. By completing the outer border of our county, we can then start focusing our efforts on doing PLSS projects within the county border. At each corner, we spend time marking out bearing trees, using a GPS to get high accuracy survey grade coordinates, and making notes to update the recorded Corner Restoration Sheet recorded in the Forest County Register of Deeds Office. There are a few benefits of visiting and getting survey grade coordinates on PLSS Corners. It helps to improve our county online parcel mapping and geographic information systems (GIS), makes it easier for landowners in our county to get a survey of their property, and if the corner is lost or destroyed, we can then remonument it. Corners can be lost or destroyed by various activities such as construction, farming, or logging. 2024 Bonus Antlerless Deer Harvest Authorizations available August 12

MADISON, Wis. – The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) today announced that bonus antlerless harvest authorizations, formerly known as tags, for the 2024 gun deer season will be available for purchase online through the Go Wild license portal and at license sales locations starting at 10 a.m. on Monday, Aug. 12, 2024.

Bonus authorizations are sold at a rate of one per person per day until sold out or until the 2024 deer hunting season ends. Bonus authorizations are \$12 each for Wisconsin residents, \$20 each for non-residents and \$5 each for youth ages 11 and under.

An online queuing system will be used to manage volume in Go Wild. All users entering the site between 9:45 a.m. and 10 a.m. will be randomly assigned a number and staged in a virtual queue. Users will be arranged randomly regardless of the actual time they enter the system. There is no advantage for customers who enter the site before 9:45 a.m. Users who log on after 10 a.m. will be added to the end of the existing queue in the order of arrival.

To complete their purchase, hunters will need to know the deer management zone and unit in which they intend to hunt, determine whether they will hunt on public or private land and have a deer hunting license approval.

The first three days of bonus sales are management zone-specific, and the fourth day is open to all zones:

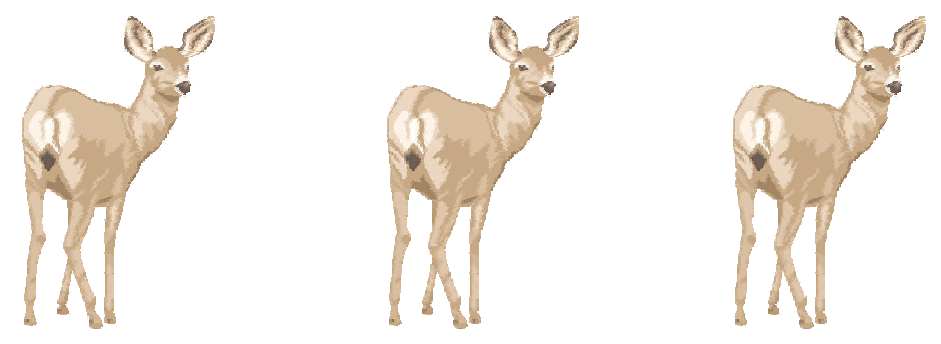
- Aug. 12, 10 a.m. – Forest Zones (Northern and Central)
- Aug. 13, 10 a.m. – Central Farmland Zone
- Aug. 14, 10 a.m. – Southern Farmland Zone
- Aug. 15, 10 a.m. – All zones available

The number of antlerless harvest opportunities will vary by deer management unit in accordance with local deer population levels. This allows for greater harvest opportunities where deer are abundant and a more conservative harvest where deer are fewer in number. Bonus antlerless harvest authorizations are available for purchase for the 2024 season in all deer management units except Ashland and Iron counties.

A listing of bonus antlerless harvest authorizations available for purchase in each deer management unit can be found on the DNR's Antlerless Deer Harvest Authorization webpage.

As a reminder, a minimum of one Farmland Zone antlerless harvest authorization is included with each deer hunting license purchase in all Farmland Zone units. Some units will offer more than one antlerless deer harvest authorization with each deer license.

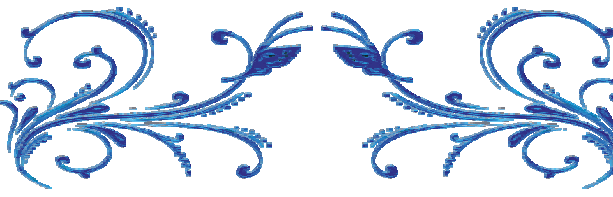

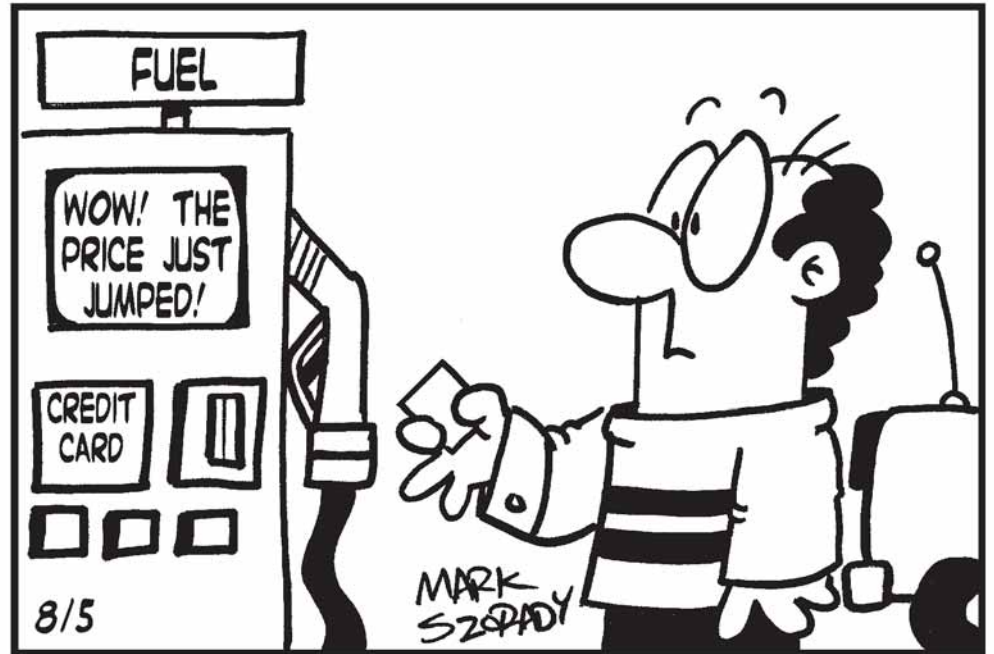


Old Time's Sake

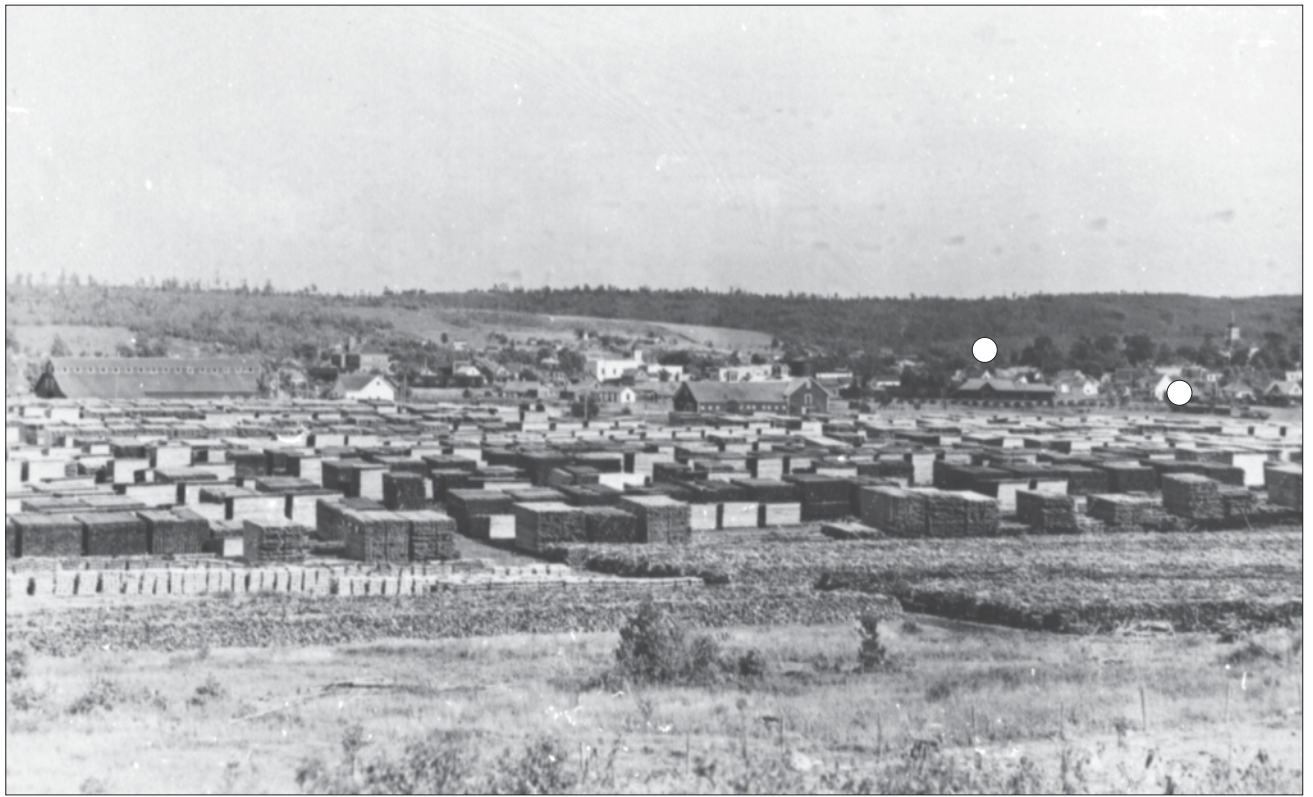

There was a sawmill on Clear Lake from 1901 until it burned in 1921. This lumber is piled and stickered so it will air dry. These piles are at the base of West Hill in Crandon. There is a lot of lumber filling that field! It is probably about 1910 in the photo. To help place you, there is a white dot we put on about where Hwy 8 is today. The C&NW depot is by the other dot, which was on Railroad Avenue, the angle street between Hwys 8 and 32/55. As can be seen looking at East Hill, there was some logging done on the hill. It is covered with trees today, giving proof that forests will grow back!

One has to wonder where these boards were used, and if people are still walking on hardwood floors that came from this lumber, or sitting in an antique chair that built from it.

"The Anishinaabe refer to the Milky Way as a 'river of souls,' and branches of the river fall down to Earth, and you travel on that river in the Afterworld, a place where we can reconnect with our ancestors." This artwork is displayed outdoors on the Nicolet College field.

Nicolet College's public art initiative not only enhances the visual appeal of the campus but also serves as a testament to the College's dedication to fostering an inclusive environment that honors and celebrates the diverse backgrounds of its community members.

"In partnership with ArtStart, Nicolet College was able to bring these inspiring, dynamic, and meaningful pieces to our campus," Jenny Bonardelli, Nicolet College arts and events manager said. 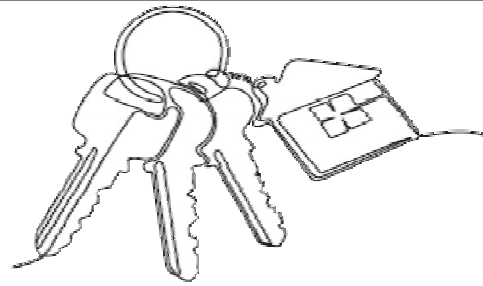

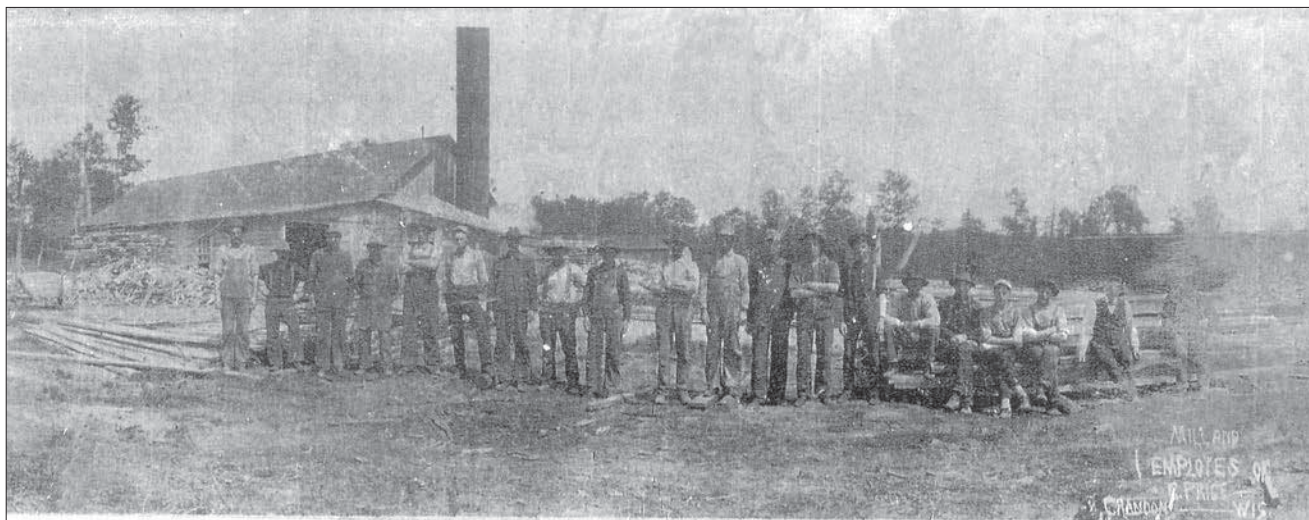

This old photo of the Price Sawmill was brought in by Art Tracy. The Price mill was in the northeast corner of Crandon, alongside the railroad tracks that can be seen in the background. This would have provided transportation for the lumber produced and sold downstate. The picture was dated on the back as 1907, and the names were written down as well. The employees were, left to right: Harv Totten, Jack Agia, Charley Maloy, Jack Yeager, unknown, unknown, Charley Bowman, Jake Mueller, Wallis Baker, Bill Webster, Allie Webster, Walt Critchot, Art Tracy, Robert Baker, Unknown, Sam Locke, Clyde McRoy, Charley Phillips, George Price (owner), unknown.

These early businesses were important to the building of a young town like Crandon. Work was provided, raw material turned into lumber that not only brought in outside money but provided building material locally. It is not known when the Price mill closed, but it should be noted that there had to be a struggle to get logs when the big Page & Landeck sawmill was operating on Clear Lake and also owned much of the timberlands.
